There will be a special concert on Thursday, June 27th at 7pm featuring Tim Zimmerman and the King's Brass which will highlight our new state of the art digital organ. Our own Michael Gagne will give a brief organ recital beginning at 6:45pm prior to the concert to showcase the new Rodgers Infinity 361 Organ.
